Part 4: Experimental Form
with Guidance Through the Process

To help organize what information should go into the Experimental section, follow these 3 steps.

Step 1: Answer the following three questions.

1. Is there any manual or text book in which a detailed lab procedure is written? If so, what is it?

2. If you ran into a friend in the hall and only had 1 minute to tell him or her how the lab was done, what would you say? Be sure to include enough information to enable your friend to reproduce your work, but remember that you only have one minute to talk.

3. Did you do anything differently from what was described in the lab manual? If so, what was it?


Step 2: Put all of the above answers together in the form of a paragraph written in the passive voice (when possible), citing all sources.

Step 3: Cite your sources in the "Sources" box on the next page. Remember to number them.

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4. Experimental
